The album contains 14 songs in the studio and an introduction. One of the album's songs (Wizard of The Hood) was previously released in the "Intelligence Violence and" and "Dog Beats" (the title of the previous release was "Wizard of Delray"). The album was remastered and reissued in 1998 by Island Records, but due to unclear samples in selected tracks, «Blackin' Your Eyes» and «Night of the Axe» are absent from reissue. The recording sessions of the album were held from 1991 to 1992 at the Miller Midi Productions and The TemperMill Studio. The album is the first Jokerâ € ™ S card in the mythology of the Dark Carnival. The texts of the album describe the Carnival to perpetrate the same brutality on the high class. Carnival of Carnage was the first album in which the Insane Clown Possi collaborated with the producer Mike E. Clark, who worked with the group for much of their career. It houses the appearances of the John Kickjazz member, which left the group before the release of the album. Although initially the album did not sell well, in 2010 he obtained the gold certification from the Riaa. Conception background Main article: Insane Clown Posse Joseph Bruce and Joseph Utsler formed a Hip Hop group in 1990. [1] With the art names Violent J, 2 Dope and John Kickjazz, the group began to perform in nightclubs with the name of their gang, Inner City Posse. [1] At the end of 1991 the group had invested more money in the production of what was covered by yields. They decided that their Gangsta Rap style was the cause of the problem: most of the time's EMCEEs used similar styles, making it difficult for Inner City possibly stand out. [2] Bruce suggested to the band to adapt a similar style to the hallucinatory and surreal «Acid Rap, just like Los Angeles represented the Gangsta Rap. The group accepted, but not to copy the style of esham up close. Instead, they suggested using horror-themed texts as an emotional outburst for all their negative life experiences. They were also unanimous in deciding not to be openly rapped on Satan, something that Esham often did. [2] After the change of musical style, the group decided to change the name. Utsler suggested keeping the initials «I.C.pâ». To inform the community that Inner City Posse was not deceased, an idea that the group approved. [2] Several names were taken into consideration before Bruce reminded his dream of Clowns around Delray, which became inspiration for the new genus and name, and everyone would donate the paint face due to the success of their former clown-painted Hype man. [2] Recording Carnival of Carnage started to record at the Miller Midi Productions of Detroit, Michigan with Chuck Miller who produces and master the album. [2] Miller accused the \$ 6,000 group to produce songs "Red Neck Hoe", "Psychopathic", "Your Rebel Flag", and part of "Night of the Ax". [3] Seeing that they were overloaded, Alex ABISS did its first main managerial move by finding another manufacturer, Mike E. Clark. [3] The group has finished recording the album with Clark at Fernale TemperMill Studio, Michigan. Clark learned his part of the album at Rythmatic Studio, and continued to work with the group during their career. The member of the original John Kickjazz group appeared on the songs "Your Rebel Flag", "Psychopathic", "Blacken 'Your Eyes", "Wizard of the Hood", "Red Neck Hoe" and "Taste". [4] "Carnival of Carnage" was originally registered by Esham at Hells Doors Studio, but he pronounced "Carnage" as "Carnicks" and refused to redeem him. [4] The final version of the song was recorded by Joseph Bruce on an inverse recording of the original. [4] The imposing DRE was originally to do a direction on "Taste". [9] The Carnival of Carnage cover was designed by Joseph Utsler, which later created works of art for the rest of the Joker's Cards series albums. [1] Mike Clark samples Smith's "Big Sur Suite" from the 1974 album Higher Ground, "The Wizard" by Black Sabbath, from their 1970 debut album, the Beastie Boys "Pass the Mic" from their 1992 album Check Your Head and the drum rhythm of "Do Da Dippity" by Champtown's single Da Dippity in 1991/2 12" in his production of "Never Had It Made".[10] The song "Psychopathic" contains an extract from "More Bounce to the Ounce" by Zapp and "Halloween theme" from the Halloween film series. The song "Redneck Hoe" contains a song from "City, Country, City" by WAR. The song "Taste" resumes "Word After Word" by Esham from Boomin' Words from Hell and "Ghetto Freak Show" fro his brother Robert used to escape from their impoverished reality by merging in a forest called "Forest of Collectors." Joe cites "Picker Forest" as a strong influence on the mythology of the Dark Carnival also derive from a dream that Bruce did shortly after the group adopted his new name, in which the spirits of a traveling carnival appeared.[2] "Red Neck Hoe" and "Your Rebel Flag" derive from the anti-bigottism philosophy of the group, based on various experiences of Bruce.[13] As a teenager, he lived for a short time in Bonnie Doone, North Carolina, a caravan parking town just outside Fort Bragg, where his brother Robert had been with the United States Army. There, Joseph first saw hatred and racism open to African American citizens, as well as minorities serving in the army, and felt disgusted and angry about the actions he did.[13] "Wizard of the Hood" was originally written by Bruce at the end of the 1980s.[14] The first recorded version of the song appeared in the EP Intelligence and Violence under the name "Wizard of Delray." The Carnival of Carnage version comes from a 1991 recording appeared on the Dog Beats EP.[14] Release Few weeks before the release of their album, John left the group because he felt that "he was taking too much of [his] life".[4] When Bruce and Utsler tried to convene a meeting to discuss problems, John did not participate.[4] The Carnival of Carnage was published on 18 October 1992, with distribution within a radius of 120 km from Detroit.[3] The number would become a recurring theme in Insane Clown Posse's work for much of the following decade.
