But unlike other Office products, Microsoft offers OneNote for free and is constantly adding new updates. A feature you may have lost: OneNote is able to incorporate content from all types of sites, with nothing more than a URL. This means URLs for YouTube and Vimeo videos, along with Spotify and Soundcloud songs, expand automatically, allowing you to play these files within OneNote itself (using you have internet access.) There is also support to incorporate Office documents uploaded to Doc.com, and everything you put together in Microsoft's Sway service. Embed the online media in OneNote If you are collecting a number of online videos for a project, or even just for fun, the built-in OneNote feature makes life much easier for you. Just copy any YouTube, Vimeo or DailyMotion URL, then paste it into OneNote. The links will expand instantly: This is much easier to track a list of URLs, because you can see a thumbnail and even play videos in a place. And because it is OneNote, you can arrange things as you like and leave a lot of context for future reference. Music works the same way, and Spotify and SoundCloud are both supported. Just copy and paste the URL, and it will expand. If you are looking for a perfect track to use in a future project, this is an easy way to fill out your options in one place. Once again, you can leave notes for future reference. Embedding Documents online The built-in PDFs are remarkably useful. Drag a PDF into a note and expand automatically, allowing you to leave notes on the margins for future reference. The online capacity allows you to extend this, a little, to online documents. Let's do something out of the way: OneNote cannot incorporate documents uploaded to Google Docs, and we bet it will not change soon. But several services are supported, including the PDF Scribd sharing site and its Microsoft Docs.com service. If you have a document from one of these services, you can paste the URL and it will expand automatically. What services are supported? We have emphasized the main services that people will be interested above, but of course there is much more. Tweets, maps and Facebook messages all comemind how potentially useful additions Microsoft might add in the future. You can add these things by embedding things into Sway, then embedding the Sway link into OneNote, but direct integration is much simpler so hopefully more functionality will come along. If you want to see some examples of how this works, take a look at this huge collection of embed examples put together by our friends at OneNote Central. This page notes some warnings, including if embedded media are supported on multiple platforms. Most platforms support most of everything, but on Android embed it will mostly just show up as thumbnails, and on Windows Phone embed basically don't work. We tested everything on Mac and Windows, and embed worked great on both! The good thing about the Microsoft Office suite is that all the programs in the collection work pretty well together. An example is the ability to link or embed Microsoft PowerPoint slides into a Microsoft Word document. That's how you do it Link vs. Incorporation Whether you link or embed the PowerPoint slide into the Word document, the goal is always the same: to provide an external reference that compliments the content within the document. However, there are some subtle differences between linking and embedding that you should be aware of. The difference between connecting and embedding an object is how the object's data is stored and how the content within the object is updated. Since data is stored differently between the two methods, the process of updating content will also be different at that time. RELATED: How to link or embed an Excel worksheet into a Word document If you link an object, then that link simply sends the player to the source object's location when it is clicked. The file itself does not store any data of the object linked to the file. This is advantageous if the object you are linking to is large and you need to reduce the file size of your Word document. The downside is that if the position of the linked object changes, the link in the Word document breaks. If you enter an object, you don't have to worry if the position of the object changes, as it becomes part of the document itself. That is, Word stores the object data in the actual Word file. The good news is that you don't have to worry about broken links in your document. The downside is that when the object is updated, these updates are not reflected in the embedded object because there is no link to the source. Also, you should consider that the file size increases with the embedded objects. Connect or embed a PowerPoint slide into a Word document difference between the ability to connect or incorporate a Microsoft PowerPoint slide into a Microsoft Word document is just one click. First, open the PowerPoint presentation that contains the slide you want to connect or incorporate. From there, select the desired file by clicking on its thumbnail preview. So, copy the slide into the clipboard fromThe keyboard shortcut CTRL + C (CMD + C ON MAC), or right-click the slide and selecting "Copy" from the context menu. Now, open the Word document you want to connect or incorporate the slide to. In the group "Clipboard" of the tab "Home", click the arrow down below "Paste." In the drop-down menu, click on "Special." Special. "It will be the special window." If you copied PowerPoint slide into the Clipboard, you will see a slide option of "Microsoft PowerPoint - Option in the box under "Click to select the option. Then, to incorporate the slide, click the bubble next to "Paste." To connect the slide, click the bubble next to "Paste Link." SELECT "Ok" to insert the connected or embedded object.
